Washburn County 4-H is part of Wisconsin 4-H Youth Development, a program of the University of Wisconsin-Madison, Division of Extension in partnership with local, state and federal government in each Wisconsin county.

What is 4-H?

4-H is a youth organization that belongs to the members and volunteer leaders. Professional leadership is given by the faculty of the Washburn County Extension University of Wisconsin-Madison. Support for 4-H programs is a joint effort of local county government, the University of Wisconsin, and the United States Department of Agriculture.

4-H is youth sharing, doing, and learning together in all kinds of projects, events, and activities in informal situations with guidance from volunteer adult leaders.

4-H members choose the projects they want to take, plan how they will go about completing their work, put their plan into action, and finally, evaluate their progress toward the completion of their goals.

4-H is youth — all youth, regardless of their creed, the color of their skin or where they live.



4-H Involves Family

Parents should be involved with their children in deciding which projects to take, what activities to participate in, how to complete the project, where to purchase supplies and if the cost is reasonable.



They should also give encouragement and supervision with projects, but allow the child to do their own work, provide a place for records and other club materials to be kept at home, and help the 4-Her to set standards of sportsmanship and honesty.

The 4-H program realizes that not every family has enough ideal time to spend with the 4-H member. No matter how much time can be given, show interest in your child. The family is the glue in the 4-H picture. Without YOU, there can be no 4-H.

4-H Activities

Camping, community service, conservation, county fair, leadership, demonstrations, recreation, speaking, and trips. In addition to activities held at the local club level, 4-H activities and conferences are held at County, district, state, and national levels.
