## **Per Washburn County Horse Project:**

- 1. Lead your horse to and from the arenas. No riding except in the arenas and in between them. Only lead horses along the blacktop drive between the forestry and exhibition hall to your trailer or the horse barn. No horses anywhere else on grounds.
- 2. When mounted or driving you must have on a SEI approved helmet and boots with heel.
- 3. Horse must have a halter and lead rope when tied to trailer.
- 4. Maintain your horse's stall, feed, and water during the fair. Close stall door completely when horse is in or out of stall.
- 5. Only wash or hose off horse by practice arena at the wash rack.
- 6. No trainer or parent may ride or lunge your horse during the fair.
- 7. Horses must be in stall by Thursday at noon and must remain in stall, except for exercise and showing, until Sunday at 4pm. Each exhibitor must keep one horse at the fair the entire duration as stated prior, that was shown in at least one class in department 6. The exception to this is Horseless Horse exhibitors and their horses, for which it's optional. Failure to do so may result in any combination of the following: loss of premiums, loss of state competition privileges, and showing privileges the following year.
- 8. Decorations must stay up until 4pm also; a release announcement will be made by the fair office indicating release of exhibits.
- Stalls must be cleaned after 4pm on Sunday of fair or you do not receive premiums.
- 10. To be able to show your horse at the fair you must attend at least two meetings during the year. It does not need to be with your horse.
- 11. To exhibit at any state horse association show you must meet the qualifications put forth by the state for entry and attend at least half of the county project meetings (all organized meetings, outings, events, fundraisers). You must also participate in one of the horse project fundraisers or pay your share of the state tack stall and sponsorship fee.
- 12. You must turn in a declaration page (first page of Horse Project Record Book form) to a Horse Project Leader by May 1st of each year. If you don't know which horse

	you're showing for sure turn in multiple forms. If you're planning to participate ir		
	the project but maybe not show, turn in a form anyway. Failure to turn in a		
	declaration form on time may prevent you from being able to show.
